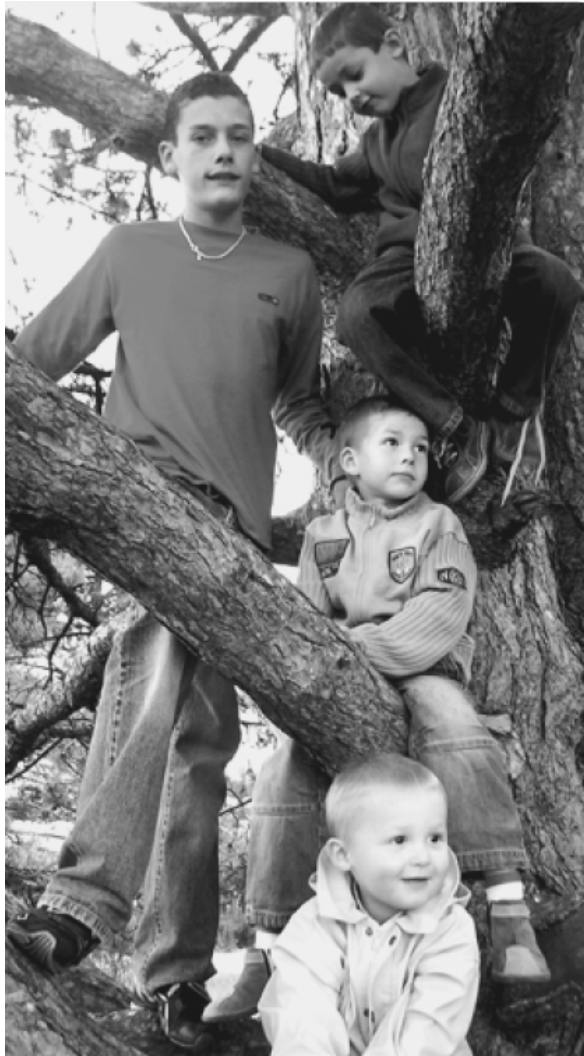

Partnerships for Child and Youth Health Indicators

Support teams of researchers and decision makers to develop and apply indicators of child and youth health and health care. Successful teams will conduct research projects on pediatric indicators in thematic areas identified as high priority by CIHR, the NCYHC and partners.

Objectives

- ❖ Synthesizing national and international research
- ❖ Assessing the validity, reliability and usability of the indicators
- ❖ Identifying selection strategies for the creation, validation and uptake of indicators given the sector, issues and available data

Objectives (cont'd)

- ❖ Assessing the local, provincial, territorial and national availability of the data required to construct and report on the indicators and the need for new data collection
- ❖ Addressing ethical and operational issues of using indicators
- ❖ Building capacity in the area of pediatric indicator research

Funds Available

- ❖ Total CIHR funding available for this program is approximately \$1 million
- ❖ The maximum CIHR contribution to each project is \$75,000 per grant over the life of the project (up to a maximum of 3 years).
- ❖ Applicants are required to find matching funding from partner(s) that provides a minimum of 50% of the costs, in cash or in-kind contributions, for a total project funding of at least \$150,000.

Knowledge Translation

- ❖ Teams of researchers and system decision-makers demonstrating meaningful partnerships and sustainable collaboration around the indicator research and its uptake.
- ❖ Proposal must explain how the research will have an impact on the decision-making process.
- ❖ Scientific review and review to assess the potential impact of the research.

Timeline

- ❖ November 07 : Evaluation of 14 proposals
- ❖ December 07 : Notification of decision
- ❖ January 08: Funding start date
