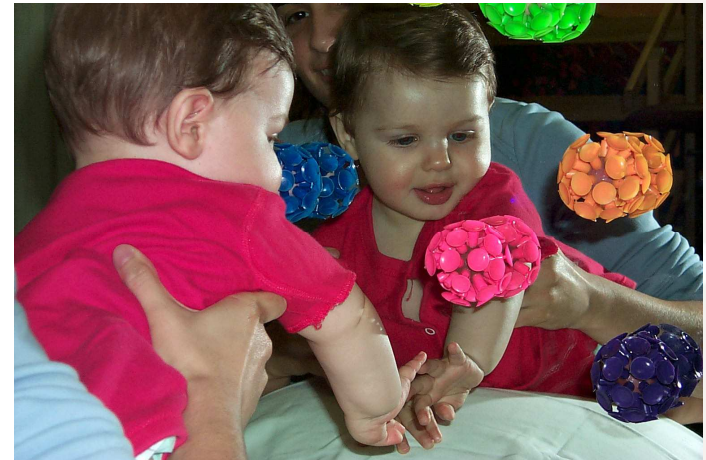
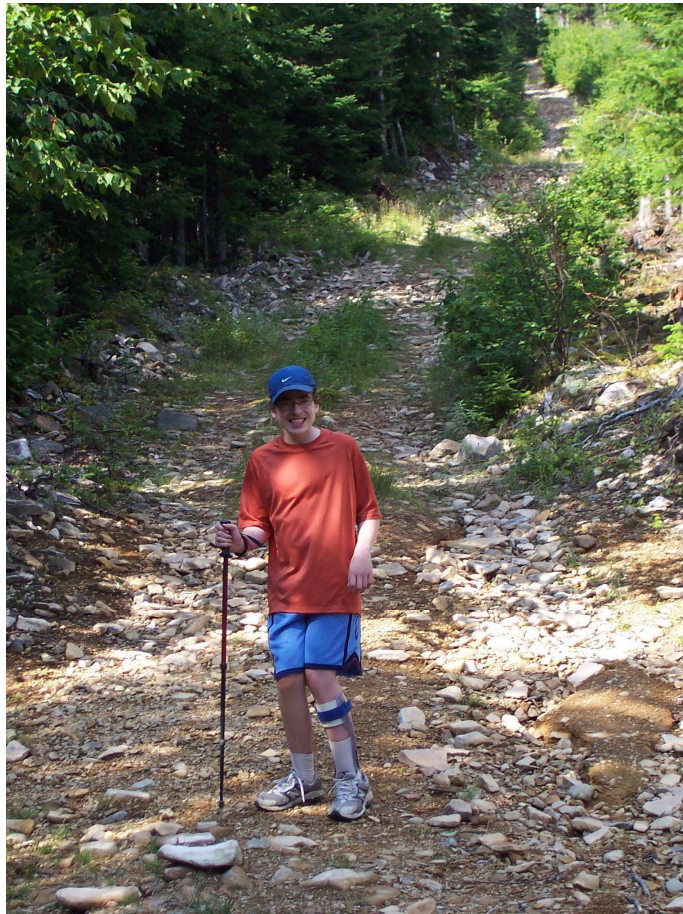
A Solid Foundation to Build From ...

- Growing network base showing interest

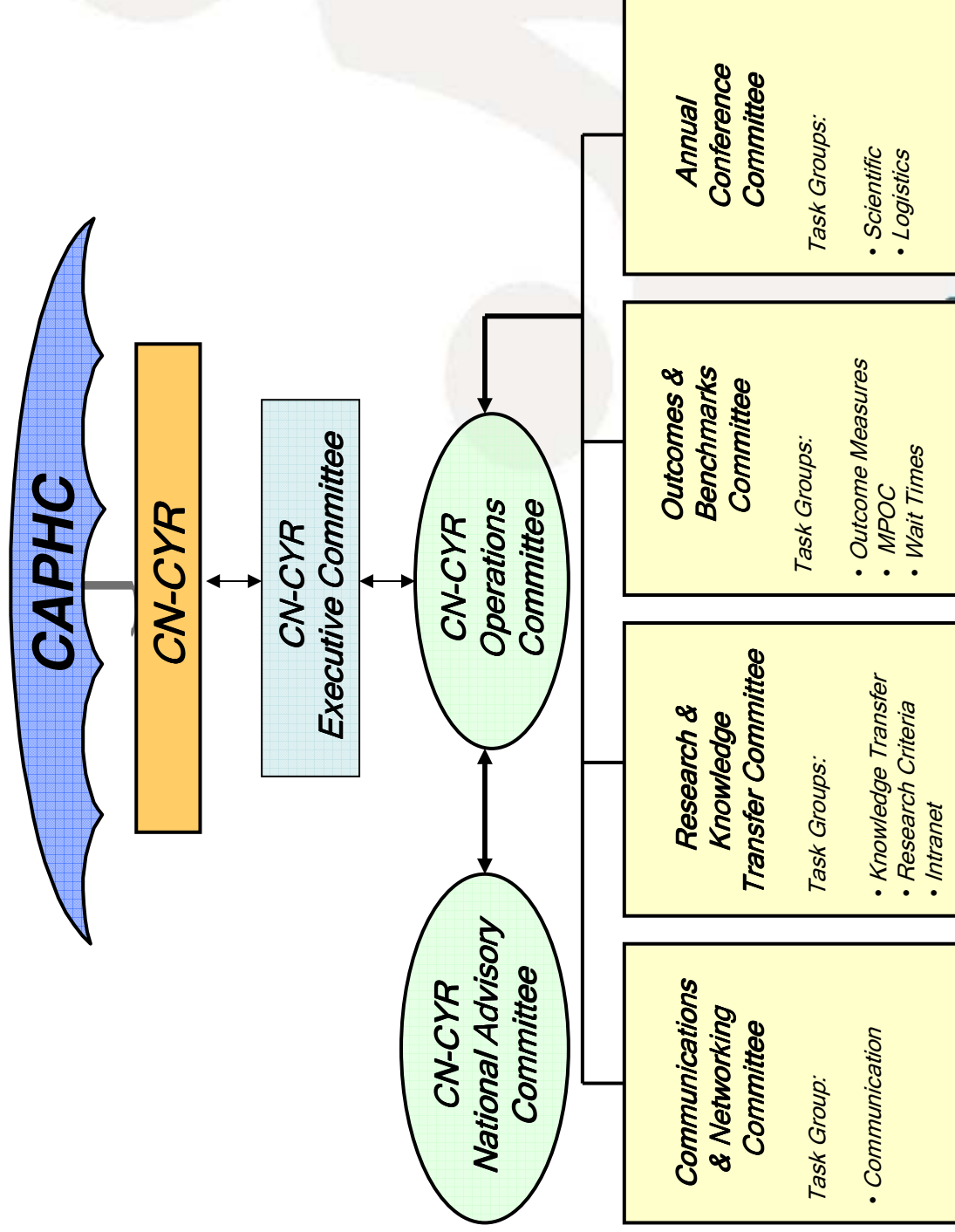


CN-CYR... the face lift!

THEMES (con't)

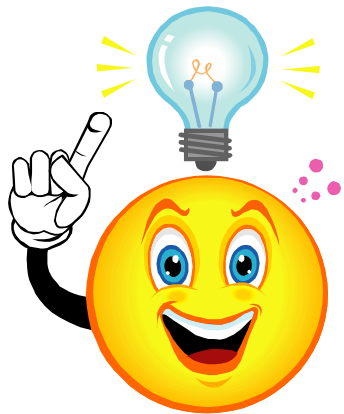

- Identify gaps in pediatric rehab research
- Pursue benchmarking opportunities (i.e. integrating ICF model)
